

FOURTEENTH ORDER EXTENDING ORDER PURSUANT TO MISS.
CODE § 33-15-17 COVID-19 EMERGENCY DECLARATION

The Board of Mayor and Commissioners of the City of Clarksdale having reviewed the ORDER PURSUANT TO MISS. CODE § 33-15-17 COVID-19 EMERGENCY DECLARATION dated March 23, 2020 hereby Orders the following Policies and Procedures to be adhered to during this State of Emergency as declared on March 17, 2020 and extended to October 26, 2020, and hereby extends the COVID-19 EMERGENCY DECLARATION and said ORDER with modifications enacted on June 22, 2020 to November 9, 2020:

1. Anyone 65 years or older, or anyone with severe medical conditions, should not be in or near crowds over 10 people.
2. Communities should strongly consider canceling events and gatherings where over 10 people will be present.
3. Follow the guidelines of the hospital and clinics if you believe you have contracted COVID-19. Call ahead before visiting any clinic or hospital for specific testing or treatment directions.
4. All police personnel should take proper precautions, such as wearing gloves and masks, when making physical contact with the public.
5. All City employees shall wear masks on duty when entering or exiting City buildings, when traversing the hallways of City buildings, when interacting with other departments, and when in contact with the general public.
6. All Citizens and visitors shall wear masks outside of their homes upon entering any business, restaurant, or other gathering, whether inside or outside, within the city limits of Clarksdale, Mississippi.

This Order will be re-evaluated on or before November 9, 2020.
